## COURSE DESCRIPTION

Small projects make great sketches for our larger works, and producing batches trains us to refine our designs and techniques. Starting with a few fun design exercises, students in this workshop will work to develop sketches on paper into finished works in wood. Students will learn to safely use the major machines of the woodshop to break down lumber, and to design and sculpt objects of their own invention such as spoons, vases, and more using the bandsaw and various hand tools. This workshop will explore shapes, forms, and surfaces, to develop pieces that can be produced in small batches or collections with designs unique to your vision as a maker. Open to all skill levels.
